KEY QUESTIONS:

- What is grace?
- What do people mean when they talk about the 'grace of God'?
- How is grace connected to the Law, sin, Jesus, salvation and atonement?

INTRODUCTION

In this session we will discover the meaning of grace to Christians, then answer the key questions before moving on to tackle an exam style question.

So, what is grace? There are several meanings to the word, but the grace we are learning about, within the context of Christianity, refers to *the undeserved love and kindness that is freely given by God to all humans*.

CONSIDER

Amazing grace! How sweet the sound That saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now am found; Was blind, but now I see.

Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, And grace my fears relieved; How precious did that grace appear The hour I first believed.

Through many dangers, toils, and snares, I have already come; 'Tis grace hath brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home. These are the first three verses of *Amazing Grace*.

TASK

- a. What did the girl mean when she said she was trying to earn 'God points' by doing lots of stuff to please Him?
- b. She said she found it hard always doing stuff. She found it stressful trying to figure out if God was pleased with her or not. What happened to make her change her approach to God? What did she find?
- c. What did this new approach mean for her life?
- d. 'Grace makes a huge difference to religion, because our faith is not about good works, but about accepting God's good grace for us.' What does this mean?
- e. Why doesn't the girl panic anymore when she forgets to pray?
- f. Explain what you have learned so far about the grace of God.
- 3. Sources of Wisdom and Authority

Your exam board will want you to show that you understand grace, but you may need to refer to Christian teachings from sources of wisdom and authority. We're going to be digging into the Bible for these.

"For it is by God's grace that you have been saved through faith. It is not the result of your own efforts, but God's gift, so that no one can boast about it."

Ephesians 2:8-9

QUESTION

How does this verse from Ephesians link with what the girl in the video talked about when she discovered God's grace?

God does this to all who believe in Christ, because there is no difference at all: everyone has sinned and is far away from God's saving presence. But by the free gift of God's grace all are put right with him through Christ Jesus, who sets them free."

TASK These

These three extracts from the Bible show us a bit more about God's grace. Explain how they are connected.

"Sin must not be your master; for you do not live under law but under God's grace."

1 Corinthians 15:3



"When the day of Pentecost came, all the believers were gathered together in one place. Suddenly there was a noise from the sky which sounded like a strong wind blowing, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. Then they saw what looked like tongues of fire which spread out and touched each person there. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to talk in other languages, as the Spirit enabled them to speak.

There were Jews living in Jerusalem, religious people who had come from every country in the world. When they heard this noise, a large crowd gathered. They were all excited because all of them heard the believers talking in their own languages."

This shows that the people of Israel were no longer living under the Law, which required them to make a sacrifice for their sins. Through the death of Jesus on the cross they were living under God's grace. This meant that God's grace now extended to everyone across the world, not just the people of Israel. Nobody needed to be separate from Godbecause of their sins. Jesus' death was the 'once and for all' sacrifice, the atonement for everybody's sin. That is amazing grace!
