INTRODUCTION

In this session we will find out what salvation is. We will then try to answer an exam style question.

Salvation means to be saved from danger. Salvation is very important to Christians.

Have you ever watched a film or TV programme where someone does something stupid and ends up in trouble? Then someone comes to save them. Sometimes the person who saves them loses stuff. Sometimes they die, even though they didn't do anything wrong...

Well that's a bit like salvation for Christians. Only in this story, we're the person who does the stupid thing and gets into trouble. So, who is going to save us? The answer is Jesus.

CONSIDER

1. Even though Jesus didn't do anything wrong, He died so that we can stay close to God forever.

We believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, begotten from the Father before all ages, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made; of the same essence as the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came <u>down from heaven;</u>

God does this to all who believe in Christ, because there is no difference at all: everyone has sinned and is far away from God's saving presence.
