READ THE 'PARABLE OF THE LOST SON':

Jesus told this story:

'There was a man who had two sons. The younger one said to his dad, 'Dad, give me my share of your money. I don't want to wait until you die. I want it now.' The dad didn't want to but gave him the money anyway.

"Not long after that the younger son left home taking all the money with him. He had lots of parties and spent all the money very quickly. When the money was all gone, he was hungry because there was no food anywhere. He went to work on a pig farm. He was so hungry that he even wanted to eat the pig's food.

Then he thought, 'I know, I'll go home. My dad will look after me. He looks after everyone really well, no one is hungry at home. When I get there, I'll tell him I'm really sorry.' So, he left the pig farm and went home.

He was very worried about what his dad would say. He'd spent all the money! He was so poor that even his clothes were rags.

He was a still a long way from his home, but his dad was looking out for him. His dad saw him and felt sorry for him, so he ran to him and gave him a big hug. He was so happy his son was home.

'I'm really sorry, Dad. I shouldn't have taken the money and spent it,' said the son. But the dad just hugged him tighter.

The dad said to his workers, 'Quick! Bring the best coat and shoes for him. Get a big party ready, my son is home! He was lost, but now he's found. He's back!' His dad gave him the family ring – now he really was back in the family.
