To understand how Christian beliefs affect their actions through a study of the Parable of the Sheep and the Goats


To investigate the nature of social justice and its importance to Christians

All will identify and describe the link between actions and beliefs. You will show some understanding about social justice and how the Parable of the Sheep and the Goats affects a Christian's life.



WHAT IS SOCIAL JUSTICE?

Justice is the concept of fairness.

Social justice refers to how fair any society is for the people within it. For example:

Does everybody have what they need to live comfortably?

Do they have equal opportunities?

Are they free to make their own choices about things like religion, work, where they live?

It has been said, that in order to survive, a human has 5 basic needs:

Air | Clean Water | Food | Shelter | Sleep

AROUND THE WORLD THERE ARE PEOPLE WHO DON'T HAVE THESE 5 BASIC NEEDS PROVIDED FOR...

and, people are mistreated and abused for all kinds of reasons:

Religious | Political | Monetary Gain

The sad truth is that, across the world, there are many countries where people are treated unfairly.

THIS IS KNOWN AS INJUSTICE.

WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT SOCIAL JUSTICE?

The Bible makes it clear that God cares very deeply about people's welfare. Jesus, in particular, often talked about being kind to the poor. He spent His time with the outcasts of society, healing and blessing them.

One of the stories he told is The Parable of the Sheep and the Goats.



EXTENSION ACTIVITY:

CHARITY 'CAKE' RECIPE

What goes into creating a charity? Show you understand by creating a charity 'cake'.

Ingredients - What do you need to put in the mix? Compassion? Love?

Method – How are you going to create it? How do you start? How long will it take to 'cook'?

YORKSHIRE PUDDING RECIPE

INGREDIENTS:

140g plain flour (this is about 200ml/7fl oz)

4 eggs

200ml milk

Sunflower oil, for cooking

METHOD:

Tip 140g plain flour into a bowl and beat in 4 eggs until smooth.

Add 200ml milk and carry on beating.

Pour the batter into a jug, then remove the hot tins from the oven. Carefully and evenly pour the batter into the holes.

Place the tins back in the oven and leave undisturbed for 20-25 mins until the puddings have puffed up and browned.
