(You may want to use Christmas cards/ advent calendars to prompt discussion). Use the Big Christmas quiz on RE:QUEST as an introduction to the next 5 lessons. Read the passage from Luke 1 How would Mary be feeling? Write a letter from Mary to Elizabeth describing what has happened. Using the films from RE:QUEST as background information - read Matthew. Discuss how God 'talks to people.'

Investigate who the gospels were written for initially. What do these visitors tell us about Jesus? Discuss the symbolism of the gifts the wise men gave. What does each one say about Jesus' life?
